



## Antimicrobial resistance hands-on-training for farmers and veterinarians

Project title & identification	Hands-on training (HoT) targeted to farmers and veterinarians working with food-producing animals to support the F2F strategy target and an efficient implementation on the ground of the new measures to fight antimicrobial resistance. Beneficiaries	The AMR hands-on training sessions are addressed to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Contact points of relevant local, national, regional and European farmers' and veterinarians' professional organisations or associations (under the overall logic of "Train the Trainers")</li> <li>• Representatives of veterinary schools (under the overall logic of "Train the Trainers")</li> <li>• Veterinarians working with food-producing animals ((including equine veterinarians for those equids considered as food-producing animals)</li> <li>• Farmers keeping food-producing animals (terrestrial and aquaculture)</li> </ul>
Objective	Provide one full day hands-on-training to the farmer and veterinarian communities working with food producing animals.  The training will: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>1)</b> inform farmers and veterinarians about the implications of the Regulations (EU) 2019/4 on medicated feed and 2019/6 on veterinary medicinal products in their daily practice in the farm.</li> <li><b>2)</b> facilitate the transition towards a reduced use of antimicrobials by informing farmers and veterinarians about measures that could prevent infection occurrence.</li> <li><b>3)</b> encourage sharing good practices that inform farmers and veterinarians about possible approaches towards a reduced use of antimicrobials in everyday practice.</li> </ol>
Outcome	The training should result in better awareness of farmers and veterinarians working with food producing animals of the latest legal framework, and their obligations regarding the prescription and use of antimicrobials.
Training sessions format	Plenary sessions with presentations on legislative updates focused to farmers and veterinarians, dynamic working group sessions focused on specific species, sharing farmers and veterinarians' perspectives, problems and solutions, with plenary debriefing sessions, and identified case studies of success stories. Networking will be facilitated during the sessions and in social events during lunch, dinner and coffee-breaks.
